

Virtual Meetings & Robert's Rules of Order

Default rule for electronic meetings:

"Except as authorized in the bylaws the business of an organization or board can be validly transacted only at a regular or properly called meeting —

That is,... a single gathering in one room or area —

Of the assembly of its members at which a quorum is present."

- Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, 11th Edition, page 97



Virtual Meetings & Robert's Rules of Order

Deliberative Assembly Defined:

A group that —

- "Meet[s] to determine, in full and free discussion, courses of action to be taken in the name of the entire group";
- Meets "in a single room or area or under equivalent conditions of opportunity for simultaneous aural communication among all participants";
- Where each member is free to act "according to their own judgment";
- · Where each member has an equal vote; and
- Where a member's disagreement with the majority does not require withdrawal from membership.

Deliberative Assembly Characteristics:

"[A] single official gathering of . . . members in one room or area to transact business for a length of time during which . . . the members do not separate."






