

### During the First Five Months of 2021

ACCORDING TO MIKE MARTIN, HPBC Assistant Executive Director for Business and Finance, during the first five months of 2021, Hawaii Pacific Baptists gave \$800,581 through the Cooperative Program and special offerings. This was up from \$738,711 given in Jan-May 2020.

### Launch or Relaunch Small Groups/Sunday School

On Tuesday, May 18, 2021, Ken Braddy led a group of pastors and other church leaders from around Hawaii, the Pacific, and Asia in a one-and-a-half-hour seminar to help churches launch or re-launch groups.

We've been encouraging all churches with the following, "If your church paused small groups for preschool, kids, students, and adults, September is an ideal time to relaunch your groups! If your church doesn't have Sunday school or small groups, September 2021 is also a great time to launch them. July and August are your key months for developing a strategy and training your leaders."

Ken Braddy, Director of Sunday School for Lifeway Christian Resources, shared from his broad experience on key considerations for the successful launch or relaunch.

Braddy shared recent Lifeway research which reported that 91% of churchgoers are planning on returning to their pre-pandemic attendance levels. He said, "As we emerge from the pandemic, churches are reopening their Bible study groups again. Now is the time for churches to rediscover Flake's Formula. In a post-pandemic world, this simple 5-step formula can help churches get back to the essentials that grow a Bible-teaching ministry.

Step 1: Know your Possibilities

Step 2: Enlarge the Organization

Step 3: Enlist and Train Workers

Step 4: Provide the Space

Step 5: Go After the People

May 14, 2021, Hawaii Pacific Baptist Wives in Ministry gathered online for another evening of fellowship and for encouragement and equipping from Patti Webb. Patti is a retired wife in ministry who served in Hawaii for many years, author, speaker, and most importantly, a woman who loves the Lord.

Patti and her husband, Henry, served in Collegiate Ministry in Hawaii from 1964-1968 and Henry was pastor of Kalihi Baptist from 1968-1977. Craig Webb, HPBC Assistant Executive Director, is their son.

In her message for wives in ministry, Patti shared her journey of coming to Christ and becoming a pastor's wife. In part of her message, she said, "... each time we have served a church. God has used that time to help me learn more about Him and being His servant. He grew me to have joy in the hard times, such as when a church member would announce to Henry that he and his family would not be back to our church. Or when I sensed or heard there was disagreement in how Henry had handled a difficult situation."

"There were also times when we were stretched financially. I truly thought we would not survive. My faith faltered often. But God would send someone to give us a monetary gift or a free night of babysitting. These were hard and struggling times. But God grew me. As I

grew in Christ and a confidence in Him and not my husband's abilities nor my abilities, God taught me about Himself as we walked through valleys of despair, and through mountains of great success."

Diana Ventura, HPBC Director of Women's Ministry, hosted this event along with the Wives in Ministry Team which includes Wendy Martin, Noe Okawara, and Barbara Webb.

# A True Work of God: Changed Hearts

what many consider to be a true work of God, Cornerstone Fellowship and The Gathering merged to become one church. Its new name is **GracePoint Church**. The merged church met together for the first time on May 23, 2021.

"Merging was not even on my radar last fall," said James Shiroma, who pastored The Gathering prior to the merge and is now the lead pastor of GracePoint Church. Shiroma said that both churches were doing well on their own and did not need to merge.

"However, over the last few months, we have seen God change people's hearts, including mine," Shiroma said. "What we thought were barriers were really not barriers. God revealed through people and circumstances that He is directing this merge. Because God is bringing two significant churches together like this, it is becoming more evident that He has a great purpose for GracePoint Church."



Shiroma who is the founding pastor of both Cornerstone Fellowship and The Gathering credits Pastor Travis Laney (Cornerstone's interim pastor at the time) for being the catalyst for this merge. Shiroma said that Pastor Laney first approached him last summer about Cornerstone and The Gathering merging.

"I did not think it was a good idea when Travis first brought up the idea to me," Shiroma said. "But Travis was very persistent because he strongly believed that merging was part of God's plan."

"I have never seen anyone so selfless and sacrificial like Travis. It would have been easy for Travis to have seen all that he did leading Cornerstone forward and decide to stay. Instead, Travis worked hard to make sure the merge happened and that the church was in good shape for me to take over."

This past February, Shiroma entered a series of many discussions with Cornerstone leaders, leaders from The





Gathering, and members from both churches. These discussions led to the eventual merge between the two churches.

Shiroma said that the process has been exciting and refreshing for people from both churches as leaders are working well together, people from both churches are building relationships, and that there is an even stronger vision

to reach the community, reach Hawaii, and reach the nations with the gospel.

"My prayer is for God to use GracePoint Church in a powerful way," Shiroma said, "Besides reaching our community and the nations, my prayer is also that we teach the Bible well, raise disciples, and raise up leaders to be sent out to make a gospel impact in Hawaii and around the world."

### Abagon, Doctor of Ministry Program




